Last month's film *Human Cargo* received 3.8 through the StarBox vote by the members.

This month's film on 30th November 2016 is *Mustang* a 2015 internationally co-produced film directed by Turkish-French film director Deniz Gamze Erguven.

The film is set in a remote Turkish village and follows the lives of five orphaned sisters and the challenges for them as they mature in a very conservative society. The film opens with a happy, innocent, carefree image of the girls coming home from school on a hot day. They are seen by neighbours who interpret the scene in a demeaning way and so the uncle steps in to reign the girls in to protect "the family's" respectability.

Deniz Gamze Erguven received very aggressive negative critiques in Turkey, so much so, that she doesn't believe she will work in Turkey again. However, she says that every girl from her generation understands the issues she has raised in the film, whilst those from her mother's generation don't see the relevance of the issues she has raised.

Before *Mustang* we have a short 6 minute film *She Sells* written and directed by Jordan Bond who comes from Inverlock. The film was filmed on the beach at Inverlock in 2015 and was accepted into the Flickerfest 2016 Short Film Festival, which opened in Bondi. The film has been shown in numerous towns and cities around Australia and this year was shown at the Keno in Melbourne and is now on ABC iview. The film depicts an epic sales negotiation between a cutthroat business executive and a surly little girl.

As this is the last film for the year there will be a door prize and drinks and nibbles. Please BYO glass if you do not want to drink from plastic or paper cups.
